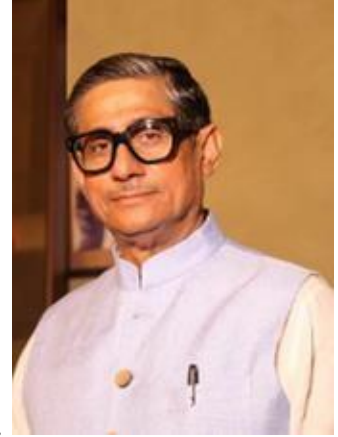

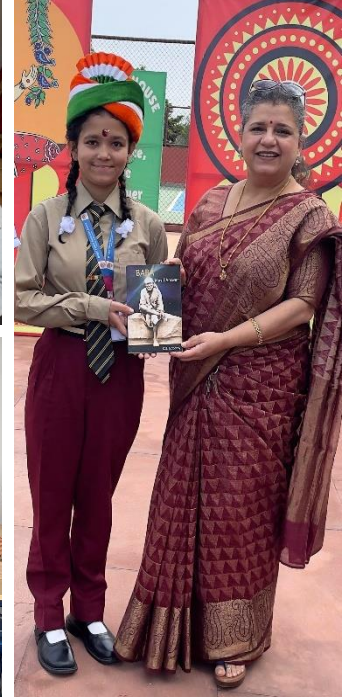
ACHIEVERS' CEREMONY (2024-25)

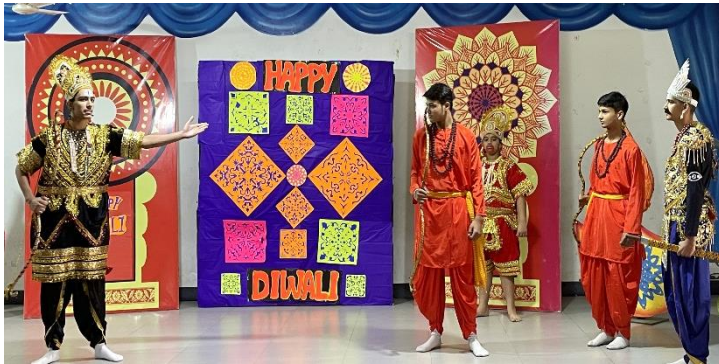


YOUTH PARLIAMENT

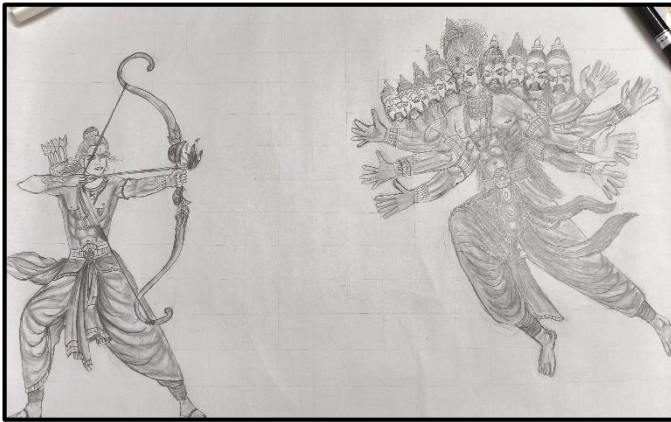
STUDENT CORNER

“DHARMA – THE LIGHT THAT GUIDES US”

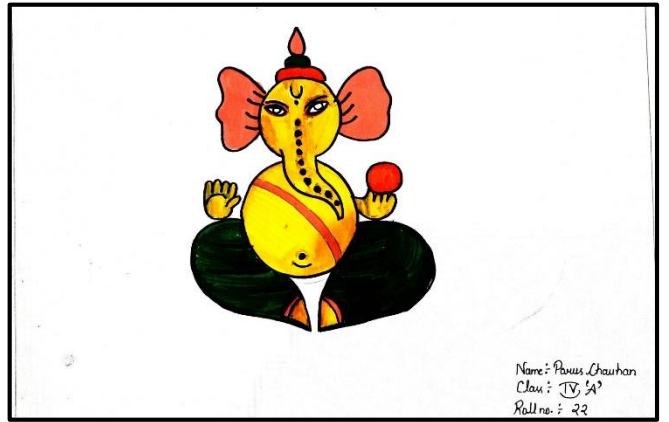
