My mind creates something new.

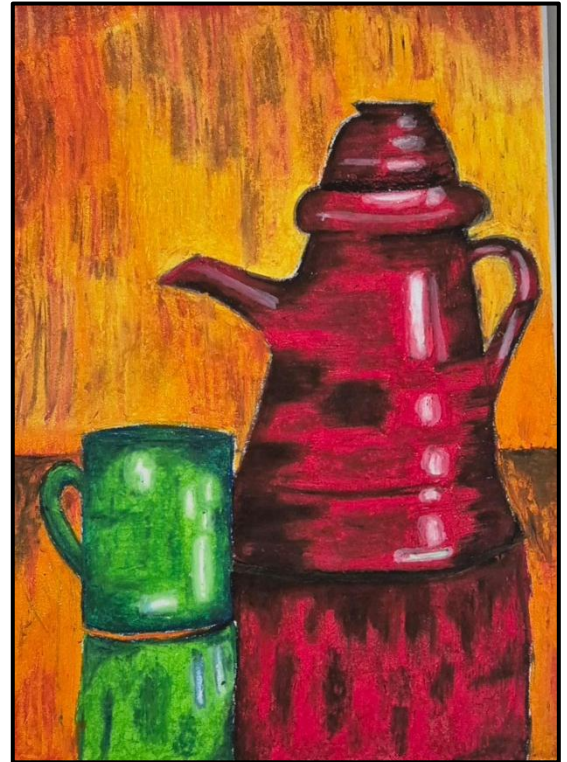
I may forget, I may be late,

“POEM - ART”

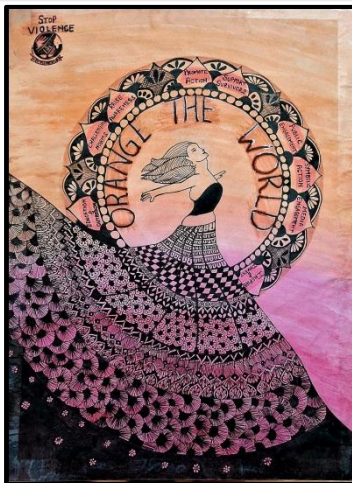
Realism, Cubism, Surrealism, Abstract,
